

Graceville College admits into year 7 (JSS1), year 8 (JSS2) and year 10 (SS1), students with distinct academic performances at entrance examination, and interview conducted by the College.

- 1. Parent seeking admission for their children shall obtain the admission pack from the secretary, at the stipulated fee, or log on to the website www.gracevilleschools.org.
- 2. The completed Graceville application form are to be returned by the date stated with 4 passport photo, medical report, birth certificate (see item A below).
- 3. Candidates are to prepare and attend the written entrance examination, and oral interview on the date slated. Parents are expected at the oral interview (B below).
- 4. Notification will be sent to candidates who are successful.
- 5. The payment of the acceptance fee (non refundable) to any of our bankers, must be receipted at the Accounts Office.
- 6. Provisional admission letter will be issued at the completion of the stipulated registration procedure.


- JSS1/2- First School Leaving Certificate, Transfer Certificate, Result of completion of JSS1
- SS1/2 Computer print out of BECE result. (State/NECO), Result of completion of JSS3/SS1, Transfer Certificate.

#### **B.** ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

At the written examination candidates shall be tested as follows:

- JSS1 English Language, Mathematics and General Paper
- JSS2 English Language, Mathematics, Basic Science & Technology.
- SS1/2 English Language, Mathematics plus (Physics, Chemistry for Science/Tech), (Government, Literature for Humanities), (Accounts, Commerce for Business).

The oral interview is majorly a test of the reading and speaking skills, and the general knowledge of the candidate.



The College provides an excellent conducive learning environment with up to-date facilities.

The structure compositions are as follows:

- A. Security Post: this is strategically located on the outermost part of the College premises. All visitors are expected to report at the security office before they are allowed into the school.
- B. Administrative Block: This houses the management office, Admission department, Bursar/Accounts Department, General office, Bookshop, healing Bay etc.

#### **ORGANIZATION**

Graceville College has established an efficient and creative team that meets the challenges of the new millennium.

In the team are experienced graduate teachers, Head of department, Vice principals, administrative Officers, Bursar and secretaries.

At the junior school, an experienced Head of school coordinates the academic activities. Leading this team is an equally resourceful principal.

#### FORM TEACHERS/STREAM HEADS

A form teacher is assigned to each class throughout an academic session. Form teachers are responsible for the personal care of all the students in their classes.

They constantly monitor the behavior and work of each student making useful reports to the school head. The junior secondary 1-3 has assistant form teachers attached to their class.

#### **CURRICULUM**

The College curriculum is unique and a blend of the Nigerian curriculum and major International curricula. Emphasis is placed on practical orientated teaching of the sciences, art and the vocational subjects.

**LIFE SKILLS**: The School boasts of an International Olympic size swimming pool and standard football pitch where students spend their leisure to keep fit.

#### **JUNIOR SECONDARY (YEAR 7-9)**

The College runs the three year National Junior secondary school programme. This is based on continuous assessment and End of course Examinations of the students in the core, vocational, and pre-vocational subjects.



After the first three years, the student sit for the state's examination; and the Federal **Basic** education Certificate examination (BECE).

So far, our students' performances at BEC Examinations have been excellent and 100% rated. We are sure to maintain this level of achievement.







#### CURRICULUM

#### SENIOR SECONDARY (YEAR 10 - 12)

The SSS new curriculum is broad based and well integrated with the international curriculum. It commences at fourth through the sixth year.

Students are placed into three main streams viz: science and technology, Humanities and Business according to their abilities. At the completion of their course work, they can successfully sit for the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination, WASSCE & NECO, Joint Admission and Matriculation Board examinations and other International examinations. These examinations are taken in the third term of their sixth year qualifying them for admission into any university in the world of their choice.

# THE FIVE GOLDEN RULES

#### **PROHIBITED ITEMS**

Students are not allowed to come to school with prohibited item such as telephone, Ipad, musical piece, sharp/dangerous objects, etc.

#### **SUBJECT MATERIALS**

In the learning of computer Science, the school have made provision for laptops.

Also for the studying of Basic Technology and Home Economics, at the Junior school, Technical Drawing and Home Management at the senior level students are allowed to provide materials.



#### **EXTRA CURRICULUM ACTIVITIES**

Students have the opportunity of participating in a wide range of extra-curricular activities for their social and physical development. The combination of our academic pursuit and extra-curricular activities balances the code of our educational process. Our students' talents, confidence and potentials are equally fostered. They are encouraged to join at least two of the clubs.

**CLUBS:** Press Club, Music/Drama, Literary and Debating, Junior Engineers & Technical Club, French, Young farmer, Mathematics and Press Club, Scripture Union. SPORTS/GAMES: Various indoor games, Badminton, Volleyball, Basketball, Football, etc.

**HOUSES:** students are also expected to be one of the following College Houses: Green House aka Anointed Yellow House aka Faith Blue House aka Divine

Orange House aka Grace Red House aka Wisdom

**LEADERSHIP TRAINING:** This is an annual event that is combined with excursion trips and interstate exploration. At the end of the one week programme, students are more toned and confident as tomorrow leaders.

#### INTERNATIONAL SUMMER EDUCATIONAL TRIP

This annual event provides the avenue for our students to see, learn and interact with students of the other part of the world. The two weeks educational trip usually takes place in August, during the school long vacation. Countries to tour include the united Kingdom, France, USA, Belgium, Spain etc.

#### **SCHOOL LIFE**

#### **Mode of Dressing**

All students wear the Graceville College uniform. At other times, they wear their sports wear and Inter-House wears. These promote a high standard of discipline and personal hygiene. All students must be properly dressed and well behaved at all times.

The boys keep a very low hair cut while the girls wear a uniform hair style (all back thread/weaving)

#### Form Size

Small classes of 20-24 students in comfortably air-conditioned classrooms and laboratories are ideal for teachers to give every students the required attention and help in their studies. The progress of each student is closely assessed and monitored and tutorials given as required.

#### Examinations.

The breakfast test, classwork, Home work and weekly tests/assignments holds to compliment the Continuous Assessment test and end of Course Examinations held at the end of each term. The College report booklets of academic records are usually issued to students on the last day of the term.

#### Discipline

The College adopts a firm but kindly frame work of discipline. Emphasis is placed on moral education and etiquette which aid students to develop self-discipline, consideration for others and good manners.

However, the following holds:

- 1. Students shall abide by the school's code of conduct
- 2. All students shall follow the school rules and regulations
- 3. Students who willingly commit serious offence, or are perpetual offenders, stands to face stricter measures
- 4. The Guidance and Counselling office is equally open to address students with peculiar needs measures.



#### Open day

Parents monitor their children's performance at the 'open Day' session. This is usually the day preceding the mid-term break or as would be otherwise notified.

#### **Fellowship**

The School's mid-week fellowship holds every Wednesday afternoon. It is a time of solemn assembly and students are encouraged to join in the fast by the entire college community.

#### Shuttle Bus

The School's air-conditioned buses bring students to school from their homes and take them back thereafter. This service has been made available at a subsidized rate.

#### **Publications**

Graceville College has 'The Golden Grace Hymn book' Annual School Calendar, Graceville Journal, readers series, Newsletter and year book, to her credits.

#### **Leadership positions**

Students Representation Council (SRC) gives student the opportunity to elect representatives and key officers typifying a free and fair election process. The elected officers services within the academic session.

Prefects and class captains are also elected to further develop our students leadership skills. The elected prefects and captains are entrusted with key responsibilities.

#### Fees

Stipulated fees are to be paid each term in advance to the College bankers and the school's receipt obtained from the bursar/account office. Details of school fees are set out on a separate sheet. School fees are made as realistic as possible to enable the college maintain the best quality education for our students.

#### **School Extension Classes**

At the certificate classes of JSS 3 and SS 3, student participate in the mandatory extension classes which takes place at the weekends and during the holiday, to further prepare them for their forthcoming certificate examinations.

#### **Notice**

A full term notice is required before the withdrawal of a student. In default of such a notice in writing, a term fees will be charged to the account of such parent.



## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

- 1. Obey all instructions from teachers and prefects.
- 2. Do not do anything that you would not like your parent/guardian to hear about.
- 3. Think of other people and behave sensibility in such a way that your action do not cause others inconveniences, embarrassment or danger.
- 4. Make sure that personal appearance, and the way you interact will make a good impression of you. Be in a clean and tidy school dress code.
- 5. Be truthful in all circumstances.
- 6. Be responsible for the up keep of the school facilities provided for use.
- 7. No language other than English may be spoken during school hours, within the school premises except at other language class (French/Igbo/Hausa).
- 8. All students must be in school on or before 7:20am Monday to Friday.
- 9. No student shall leave the school premises before school closes at 3:45pm (Mondays, Thursdays) or 3:00pm (Friday).
- 10. Students who have to visit the hospital and so miss lessons must inform the form teacher and the Vice principal.
- 11. If a student is absent, even for one day, he/she must bring a note of explanation from parent or guardian.
- 12. No large sum of money except what is absolutely necessary shall be brought to the school. There must be no borrowing of money. Proper care must be taken of other items that may be brought to school every day especially Textbook/Notebooks
- 13. No student in school uniform shall buy/eat food on the street or during classes. Chewing gum is not allowed.
- 14. Student shall not receive visitors in the classroom. All such visitors must first call at and obtained permission from the administrative officer.
- 15. Private / commercial vehicles conveying students to the school must drop such student at the school gate.
- 16. Loitering along the corridor when lesson are on is prohibited. Students must show respect to all staff.
- 17. There would be no ill-treatment of any other student. Any student caught bullying any junior and/or another student will be punished appropriately.
- 18. Fighting or use of abusive language is strictly prohibited.
- 19. Students shall behave sensibly and courteously to everyone.
- 20. Students shall be good ambassadors of Graceville College.


